



# Foundation Stage 2 Newsletter: Autumn 2

Dear Parent/Carer,

We hope you've had a relaxing and enjoyable half term break! It has been lovely to see the children settling back into the swing of things this week and they are now eager to start our new and exciting theme for this half term 'I wonder what's out of this world'.

### Maths

The children will learn to recognise, write and represent numbers in different ways. Following our White Rose Maths programme, the children will look at representing, comparing and the composition of numbers to 6 and beyond. We will continue to talk about the properties of 2D shapes focusing on circles, triangles and 4 sided shapes. Children will talk about night and day and begin to order key events in their daily routine.

### Literacy

We will be reading a range of books to support our theme 'I wonder what's out of this world'. We will continue to develop the children's handwriting skills, focusing on their letter formation. Children will start to create short, simple sentences using finger spaces. Lots of time will be spent supporting the children's oral blending which will help the children to segment the words they want to write. In phonics this half term the children will be learning 12 new sounds: ck, e, u, r, h, b, f, ff, l, ll, le, ss

### Exploring Art and Design

The children will create artwork based on their interests and fascinations. They will construct using a range of materials and techniques. We will work together to create 3D models linked to our theme around space. We will also complete a range of Winter/Christmas crafts.

## I wonder ... what's out of this world.

### Communication and Language

We will be continuing to develop the ability to listen during carpet time sessions. The children will be learning to answer questions about a story and begin to make simple predictions based on what they have read/seen in the pictures.

### Physical Development

The children will be practising their throwing and catching skills, as well as perfecting their travelling techniques by changing speed and direction. We will explore the different ways of balancing and continue to build our fine motor skills through our inside and outside provision activities.

### Understanding the World

We will talk and learn about important celebrations from around the world and children will begin to understand why people do/do not celebrate certain festivals and celebrations. The children will be introduced to some important figures from the past linked to this half term's theme.

### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will continue to use the Zones of Regulation in the classroom and talk about self-help techniques. The children will develop their vocabulary around emotions and begin to use our classroom displays to help them identify how they are feeling.

### Our Place in Our World

We will develop our knowledge of the wider world by talking about Christmas around the world. We will talk about traditions and celebrations.

### Aspiring Entrepreneurs

We will continue to reflect on our work to ensure that we are able to improve it and see how we make it even better.

### Healthy and Happy Living

We will continue to share our ideas in a range of different and imaginative ways. Allowing children to have a voice with their learning.

### Inquisitive Investigators

We will encourage children to predict and summarise key events in a story. Enabling children to develop key vocabulary linked to different stories.
