



Year 4 Newsletter: Spring 2

Dear Parent/Carer,

Welcome back to a new term! We hope that you have all enjoyed the holidays and that the children are eager to get started once again. Below is an overview of what your child/children will be learning this term. You will already have seen that we are trialling a different homework format this half term. The aim is to streamline the homework and focus it on the things that the children are really engaged in and the popular craft challenges, as well as rewarding the regular reading, spelling and times table practice that are so vital to children's ongoing education and progress. Please keep pushing regular reading, spelling and times table practise for your child/children.

Maths

In Year 4, our maths topic this half term is fractions and decimals. Pupils will be learning about how to find equivalent fractions, identify fractions over 1 and look at fractions of amounts. We will continue to practise our times tables as this knowledge will be very useful when working with fractions and decimals as well as getting us ready for the Multiplication Tables Check.

English

This half term, we will focus on two texts: 'The Paperbag Prince' and 'Tin Forest'. Children will explore the key themes and events of these two books and identify how these events are similar. As we read the stories, children will gather vocabulary and then write their own story that follows a similar theme. Children will develop their own characters, plot and setting.

Computing/ Art

In Computing, children will explore audio sounds. They will test and identify what environment and equipment are best suited to recording audio and then use their new knowledge and skills to record a podcast.
In Art we will be exploring printing and linking this with our History topic by printing hieroglyphics.



Science

Our topic is 'Animals including Humans'. Children will learn about oral hygiene and how to maintain a healthy set of teeth and gums. Children will create their own leaflet for a dentist. Children will also investigate the digestive system by completing a very messy investigation involving tights, orange juice and crackers!

History

Our focus will be on the Ancient Egyptians and why they are still remembered today. To help us understand this, we will look at what the different roles were in society, the River Nile, Tutankhamun, Mummification and Egyptian Gods.

RE/PSHE

In RE we will be looking at why Gurus are at the heart of Sikh belief and practice.
In PSHE, we will be looking Drug, Alcohol and Tobacco Education, specifically the physical and psychological risk and consequences.

PE/Music

This half-term Year 4 will be starting their new module where they will be running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination in a variety of different games. In music our topic will be 'Feelings through music' where we will look at different genres of music and use a range of instruments to express different feelings.

Our Place in 'Our' World.

Aspiring Entrepreneurs

Children will continue to face Year 4 challenges with a growth mindset and develop as reflective learners. Children will reflect on their work in lessons and consider ways they could improve.

Healthy and Happy Living

Linked with our Science topic we will be looking at oral hygiene, how to look after our teeth and the importance of visiting the dentist.

Inquisitive Investigators

We will use our investigative inquiry to help us answer our enquiry question in History. Also, we will investigate the positive and negative effects of
