Your children will be sitting their KS2 SATs during **w/c Monday 12<sup>th</sup> May**. They have all worked very hard and are ready. It is important that they get plenty of sleep over the weekend before the tests and hopefully enjoy some fresh air.

Tuesday 13 <sup>th</sup> May	English Reading
Wednesday 14 <sup>th</sup> May	Maths Paper 1: Arithmetic and Maths Paper 2: Reasoning
Thursday 15 <sup>th</sup> May	Maths Paper 3: Reasoning

**Breakfast:** Please ensure that your child has breakfast and a drink on the morning of each test. If you would like your child to have breakfast in school, we will be offering toast for children on the morning of the tests (Monday to Thursday from 8am). **If you would like your child to attend this for free during SATs week, please could you contact the office before Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> May.**

**Water:** Children may wish to bring a water bottle into the test with them. Please make sure it is a plain bottle with any writing covered up. It should be labelled with their name. Please also make sure it is a sports top bottle to limit the possibility that it will spill. See example pictures:



**Watches:** Please ensure your child does not wear a watch to school during SATs week. There will be a clock in each exam room so children can check the time during each test.

**Sickness:** We would like to take this opportunity to remind you that all pupils **must** be present for the SATs tests; no holiday will be permitted during this period. Even if a child feels unwell, please send them to school for their tests. We will send them home once they have completed the tests if required.

Once again, we want to say thank you for all your support. Those children who have regularly attended their boosters have really benefitted from these. Please remind any children that are worried about SATs to leave the worrying to the teachers.
