



Foundation Stage 2 Newsletter: Spring 1



Dear Parent/Carer,

Happy New Year to all! The children have settled straight back into the swing of things and are following school routines well. Our new and exciting theme for this half term is 'I wonder what moves.'

Maths

We will continue to use White Rose Mastery maths to develop learning. There will be a focus around the numbers 5,6,7 and 8. Children will be taught about number bonds e.g. $3+2=5$, children are expected to know all of the numbers bonds to 5 by the time they leave Reception. We will also have some formation focus sessions which will teach the children how to write each number correctly. Please help your child to practise recognising numbers, counting and talking about one more and one less at home.

Literacy

We will be reading a range of books to support our theme 'I wonder what moves'. We will share some non-fiction books and learn the difference between fact and fiction. This will help us with our non-fiction writing. We will continue to focus on writing simple sentences.

Phonic sounds: j, v, w, x, y, z, zz, qu, ch, sh, th Please help your children learn how to recognise and write these sounds along with the tricky words sent home at the end of last half term.

Expressive Art and Design

The children will continue to create art work linked to their interests. Different materials and resources will be available and different activities set up each week to encourage them to try new things. We will also be taking part in some music sessions too.

Physical Development

The children will continue to practise their throwing and catching skills, as well as perfecting their travelling techniques by changing speed and direction. We will explore the different ways of balancing and continue to build our fine motor skills through our inside and outside provision activities.

Understanding the World

This half term's topic will lead us to learn about people, animals and transport. We will spend a lot of the time looking at the past and how transport has changed over time. We will look closely at a variety of animals and how they move and also how we move as humans. We will also celebrate events such as Chinese/Lunar New Year.

Communication and Language

We will continue with our poetry sessions which will expose your child to many different poems. This will encourage children to listen, rehearse and perform which will enhance their communication skills. Look out for lovely videos of these on Class Dojo.

Our Place in Our World.

We will develop our knowledge of the wider world by talking about celebrations and traditions from the world.

Aspiring Entrepreneurs

We will continue to reflect on our work to ensure that we are able to improve it and see how we make it even better.

Healthy and Happy Living

We will continue to share our ideas in a range of different and imaginative ways. Allowing children to have a voice with their learning.

Inquisitive Investigators

We will encourage children to predict and summarise key events in a story. Enabling children to develop key vocabulary linked to different stories.
