This supports pupils in building eco-awareness and a deeper understanding of the interconnectedness between people, places, and the planet. Our geography curriculum is enriched through the study of significant geographers, explorers, environmentalists and adventurers from a range of backgrounds and time periods. These individuals help children to understand how geography shapes our world and how people can investigate, protect and connect with different places and environments. By learning about both historical and modern geographers, pupils develop curiosity about the world, an awareness of global issues and an understanding of the role they can play as future geographers. Through these role models, children are encouraged to explore, question, observe and care for the world around them.
